Today (August 1, 2017) is the first day that 2019 DP's can be included in trades.

The Races:

In the American League Baton Rouge Silver Bullets went 17-13 to stay in first place. But, Alpharetta with a 16-11 run was able to cut Baton Rouge's lead from 11 games down to 6 ½. Alpharetta also has made a number of trades to get ready for the postseason. Milford got back on the winning side going 9-8 to remain in 3rd place. New Hampshire was 18-12 and cut Milford's lead to just 1 ½ games. Nashville with a 19-16 run has moved in front of Lake Wobegon by .005 percentage points for the final playoff spot. The AL races have gotten tighter. Who will stay hot and who will fade? It's going to be fun in the AL!

In the National League US Jarheads went 19-9, a .679 winning percentage and saw their lead over Hazardville shrink from 8 games to 5 as Hazardville went 23-10, a .697 winning percentage! Allyn Street with a 16-6 record held onto 3rd with a 9 game lead over 4th place Connecticut. Connecticut went 13-19. New England at 8-4 went from 6th to a percentage point in front of Klee's for 5th place. Klee's had a second losing period going 16-19.
